As an artist who has been performing since the age of 17, Guitar Shorty still carries the passion and the licks to hook his audiences. Born in 1939 in CA but raised in the south, this bluesman belts out tough soulful lyrics with guitar riffs to match. Influences include B.B King, Earl Hooker and T-bone Walker, and he counted Jimmy Hendrix as a contemporary and friend. His crazy, on stage antics include somersaults and back flips, but all the while he holds onto his ax.
